



International Hip Preservation Society (ISHA) - 2023 Annual Scientific Meeting

- Brings hip preservation, prevention and treatment to all people, regardless of age, social status, gender or economic situation.
- Improves detection, diagnosis and access to skilled treatment.



October 5-7, 2023, Cape Town, South Africa

Objectives:

- Boost awareness of hip preservation surgery in Africa, including the value it brings to patient quality of life and its socioeconomic value.
- Speak with stakeholders to identify challenges and barriers preventing hip preservation adoption in Africa.
- Identify orthopedic surgeons in Africa who are interested in being trained in hip preservation surgery.
- Leave a skills training programme legacy across Africa.





Event Highlights:

- Developed an adolescent screening pilot programme, which determined that 16.9% of 123 participants screened had undiagnosed hip disease.
- Partnered with East Africa Arthroscopy Association and Mater Hospital in Nairobi to introduce a programme where experienced surgeons travel to Kenya to train local surgeons and operate on patients.
- The goal is to train enough surgeons within a two-year period to **sufficiently treat local patients**, then expand the programme across the continent.

Innovative Elements:

- Local and regional partnerships addressed challenges unique to each territory in Africa.
- **Digital-first strategy** enhanced ISHA's existing content with live formats enabling Kenya-based surgeon trainees to interact with world-leading hip arthroscopy practitioners.
- **Collaborated with medical innovator Proximie**, which offers a series of live broadcasts in operating theatres around the world, to build a broadcast feed from South Africa. Using the multiscreen capability, global experts acted as proctors for hip operations, enabling trainees to learn rapidly and effectively.
- Partnership with industry partners Arthrex, Smith + Nephew and Stryker to help with delivery and supply of equipment into the region, as well as the provision of future cadaveric training workshops.



Evidence of Impact:

- The programme involved 20 surgeon trainees attending 12 virtual training sessions. Feedback reports indicate satisfaction levels over 98%.
- Medical expert Dr. Josip Cakic, who travelled to Kenya from South Africa in April 2024 as part of the program launch, operated on 10 patients and achieved a 100% patient satisfaction rate. The initial call for patients received over 150 applications.
- Second Kenya visitation programme took place 20-24
 September with four days of surgical procedures and second phase of local surgeon in-person training.
- Provision by ISHA of regional funding travel bursaries to enable surgeon trainees to travel to established hubs in South Africa, Turkey and Egypt to spend fellowship training time with experts.
